Management decisions on appropriate practices and policies regarding tropical forests often need to be made in spite of innumerable

uncertainties and complexities. Among the uncertainties are the lack of formalization of lessons learned regarding the impacts of previous

how to socialize the information and knowledge gained so that change is transformational and enduring. The main complexities lie in
